IV. Cherryland ivy problems (Rick Hatcher)

Rick Hatcher is requesting ivy problems be brought to TAB attention. There are 2 trees he's concerned about on Hampton Rd. One at Lowell, the other at 462 Hampton. He wants the ivy removed from the trees and is concerned about the overall health of the trees. 1 Black Walnut, 1 Chinese Chestnut. The protocol is it's the responsibility of the property owner to remove the ivy. If the property owner doesn't handle, under the ordinance, county would be responsible for it. Not sure if owner could be billed for work performed.

Dan assumes a health threat is posed because the ivy will grow into the upper canopy of the tree shielding it's food source. This could result in the tree dying. Motioned that Inta would (1) send out notifications and (2) find out if there's any legal action that can be taken.

She also added that aside from Castro Valley Blvd. the County has not really had any problems with businesses trimming trees.
